Wider objective:

To contribute the modernisation of higher education systems in Ukraine by introducing universities centres of teaching excellence for promotion of European educational innovations by professional university teachers' certification.

Specific project objectives:

- To modernise the formal system of university teachers' professional development and certification in Ukraine by establishing of 9 independent Centres of Teaching Excellence, as well as creating their network, focusing on enhancing quality of university teaching;
- To introduce the professional university teachers' certification programs based on European good practices and education innovations for ensuring teaching excellence;
- To develop and pilot a new teaching excellence curriculum based on teaching excellence framework, including courses syllabi and MOOCs which are permeable with education needs of academic communities in Ukraine and resulting in professional certification of university teachers.

Expected results:

- Benchmarking research conducted.
- Strategy and model for Teaching Exellence developed.
- Selected staff retrained in EU.
- CTEs offices opened.
- Professional standards for university teachers developed.
- Regulation for teacher attestation improved.
- Teaching excellence curriculum developed.
- Evaluation methodology for certification created.
- Trainees for pilot groups enrolled.
- Certification programs accredited.




Project Management Board meeting (4.08.2021) in online mode

On September, 21-23, at Wroclaw University of Science and Technology the UTTERLY project members' meeting titled "University teachers' certification centers: innovative approach to promote teaching excellence" took place in hybrid mode.



On **the first day** of work, the main achievements and results of the first project work package were discussed.

On September 21, 2021 (the first day of the meeting) the project coordinator from Ivan Franko National University of Lviv Vitaliy Kukharsky came out with a keynote speech, plans and key issues of the meeting. Mariusz Mazurkiewicz, representative of the Wroclaw University of Science and Technology presented benchmarking analysis results that had been conducted within the implementation of the first work project package.

Svitlana Kalashnikova, from Institute of Higher Education, National Academy of the Educational Sciences of Ukraine presented the strategy and model for teaching excellence. Asta Raupeliene, representative of Vytautas Magnus University of Lithuania, spoke about Objectives and Outputs that had been achieved.

In general, as a result of the first working day of the meeting in Wroclaw, the main achievements of the comparative analysis were discussed and strategic goals for the development of teacher certification centers were set.

- training programs for the Centers employees, which will take place in Bayreuth (Germany) and in Paris (France).








Monitoring of the project (29.09.2021) in online mode

On Wednesday, September 29, the Erasmus office monitored the project. During the online meeting, the UTTERLY coordinators and managers presented reports on the project's progress.

The Vice-Rector for Research, Teaching and IT Development of Ivan Franko National University of Lviv Vitaliy Kukharskyy opened the meeting with his report. It provided the basic information on challenges, changes, best practices, coverage, equipment involved, certification programs implemented, etc. "UTTERLY opens new opportunities for growth in education, we are proud that Lviv University has become one of the catalysts for such changes in Ukrainian education," said Vitaliy Kukharskyy.

Then the partners made short presentations on their progress within the project and the results that had been achieved. Lviv University was represented by Olha Oseredchuk, Head of the Marketing and Development Center. In her presentation she described in detail the process of certification program implementation at the University, its results, challenges and solutions.



Training "Strategy and Model of the Center for Teaching Improvement" (07.12.2021–10.12.2021)

On December, 7-10, at Ivan Franko National University of Lviv, the training "Strategy and Model of the Center for Teaching Improvement" was provided for the participants of the UTTERLY project.

During the training, representatives of the partner universities from all over Ukraine discusses a range of vital questions: Which direction does higher education move on? What are the models of a modern university and its strategies for improving teaching? What should a university lecturer's profile be? Besides, the participants focused on institutional policies related to promoting teaching excellence.









Vitaliy Kukharsky, the Vice-Rector of Ivan Franko National University of Lviv highlighted: "The University has had some experience in launching two courses to improve teaching skills, so we are happy to support another joint initiative with the UTTERLY, which aims to help Ukrainian universities to make sense of the nuances connected with teachers certification and apprecuiate the role of the certification centers."
